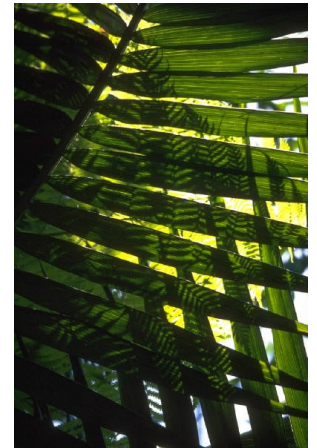

Shabbat Parashat KiTetze

Thoughts for the week – the ox and the election

In this week's Parsha we have 72 Mitzvot, which makes this Parsha the one with the most mitzvot in the whole Torah.

One of the interesting Mizvot in the Parsha deals with our attitude towards the animals: "*You shall not muzzle an ox in its threshing*"(Devarim 25,4); the Torah teaches us that when someone plows his field with his ox, or with any other animal, he is not allowed to muzzle the mouth of the animal and prevent it from eating while plowing the field. Even the animals have the right to work and enjoy a meal while working.

A few years ago, when one of the Israeli Prime Ministers was asked where monies of the public had gone, he answered: "*you shall not muzzle an ox in its threshing*", which means – how can you expect the ministers to keep their hands clean while they sit next to a bowl full of money? Obviously this is wrong. A man is not an animal, and especially a person who decides to devote himself to the benefit of the public must keep himself clean and honest in the eyes of all.

In every election, politicians release promises and try to give us the feeling that they care about us.

Yes, it is very important to vote (try not to during Shabbat if you can!), especially for the one you think will be the most beneficial to the Jewish Community.

But do not forget that the Jewish nation too has an election soon, on Rosh Hashanah. We vote clear and loud with the Shofar: "*Hashem is the King of the universe!*" Let's all get ready for these special days of holiness; they are only 3 weeks from now!
